Singing Men of Arkansas to sing for Galway Hospice

THE Singing Men of Arkansas will sing at St Nicholas's Church on Friday, April 30 at 8 pm with all proceeds going to Galway Hospice.

Utilising a broad variety of repertoire, the Singing Men of Arkansas endeavour to inspire and entertain audiences through dynamic choral performances. The group is dedicated to singing a wide range of both secular and sacred music.

The men will be travelling throughout Ireland and will perform a number of charitable concerts. All proceeds from the Galway concert will go towards the funding of the Galway Hospice Home Care and Day Care services, which depend on voluntary contributions.

Last year the Galway Hospice Home Care team made almost 5,000 Hospice at Home visits to patients and their families throughout Galway, including the Aran Islands. There were 1,492 attendances by patients to the Day Care Centre, who availed of a blend of clinical,



therapeutic and recreational supports, which also served as a link between in-patient and community-based services.
